

## **Bringing Your Firearm To The Canadian ICORE Regional Championship at Frontenac Rifle and Pistol Club, September 7 and 8, 2018**

This document has been specifically prepared for the 2018 Canadian ICORE Regional Championship. These instructions will not be applicable for any other scenario.

Canada does not have a Concealed Carry Weapon (CCW) program. Please note that any CCW permit that you have will not be recognized. Furthermore, firearms with a barrel length of under 105mm (4.1 inches) are not permitted for importation to Canada.

Firearms permitted for entry, must be approved in accordance with the instructions below.

### **The Correct Paperwork:**

You will need two pieces of paperwork to successfully cross the border:

1. CAFC 909 Non-Resident Firearm Declaration ([form RCMP 5589](#)). If more than 3 firearms ([form RCMP 5590](#)) is needed as well. <http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/cfp-pcaf/information/visit/index-eng.htm>
2. Authorization to Transport (ATT) – Restricted Firearms

Print and complete the form RCMP 5589 with the exception of your signature. The signature must be completed when you reach the border, in the presence of the border agent.

Scan the completed form RCMP 5589, create a PDF file and send it by e-mail to the address below, for the Chief Firearms Office (CFO) of Ontario to issue an ATT. Also send a scanned copy of your match registration. With the above information, please include: 1. the days you will be in Canada 2. What border crossing you will be entering and exiting Ontario.

**The ATT application should be made at least three weeks in advance of the match.**

The CFO will contact you if additional information is required.  
Give yourself plenty of time for the ATT, just in case you miss something out that is required to complete the process.

## **Crossing the Border:**

When you reach the border all firearms must be declared. The Border agent will be looking for three pieces of information:

Completed (but as yet unsigned) form RCMP 5589, which was used to obtain your ATT

Your ATT

Confirmation of your match registration

A fee of \$25 Canadian for the process is collected at the border

You be permitted to import up to 1500 rounds for personal use

## **Transportation of your Firearms:**

In Canada handguns fall into a general class of firearms, referred to as restricted. Canadian Firearms regulations define how restricted firearms must be transported and you must comply with the following:

- Unload the firearms; and; **and**
- Attach **secure locking devices (trigger or cable lock)** to the firearms; **and**
- Lock the firearms in a sturdy, non-transparent container

## **Leaving Any Class of Firearm in an Unattended Vehicle**

- Lock containers carrying restricted firearms in the trunk or in a similar lockable compartment. • If the vehicle does not have a trunk or lockable compartment, put firearms and firearm containers out of sight inside the vehicle and lock the vehicle. *\* Or any additional information or clarification regarding bringing your revolvers to the Canadian ICORE Regional Championship please contact Karen Amon at the number provided above.*
